

19th Operation Coordination Unit Meeting was held on 08.09.2021. The project team informed the participants about remediation works, plans for the face-to-face trainings and communication activities.



Trainings

Capacity building activities are ongoing in line with COVID-19 measures. The central and provincial directorates of the Ministry of Environment and Urbanization are coming together with the Health Risk Assessment and Alternative Technologies trainings. The first face-to-face training, which will be held on 11-12-13 October 2021 in İzmir, will also be open for online participation.

Workshops

Face-to-face workshops will be organized for the studies to be carried out within the scope of the "Regulation on Control of Soil Pollution and Sites Contaminated By Point-Sources". The workshop series, which will be attended by the central staff of the Ministry of Environment and Urbanization, will start as of November.

Merkim, 2021

To raise awareness about the POPs stocks and contaminated sites, the works carried out in Merkim are being recorded. Asbestos roof was removed under the control of a licensed company by taking all necessary precautions regarding occupational health and safety in the site. The process from the roof dismantling and building demolition, which has been hosting POPs waste for many years, to the disposal of construction waste will be shown in a video. The project and video shooting team visited Merkim on 14-15 September 2021 to record the roof dismantling phase and follow the process.
